NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the Adoption of LCB No. R062-19 Of the Board of Occupational Therapy

The Board of Occupational Therapy will hold a Public Hearing at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, November 23, 2019 at the Board Administrative Office, 6170 Mae Anne Ave, Suite 1, Reno, Nevada 89523, teleconference access 1-888-273-3658, access code 8751529.

The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested parties regarding the adoption of regulations that pertain to LCB File No. R062-19, Chapter 640A of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The proposed regulation revises the fees charged by the Board for renewal of a biennial license, reinstatement of a license; conversion of a license from inactive status; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1. Need and purpose of the proposed regulations or amendments

The need for the proposed regulations is to protect the public health, safety and welfare by ensuring that only qualified and competent occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants are licensed in the state.

The purpose of the adopted regulation is to provide clarity for the public, individuals and licensees through regulations. The proposed regulation provides for revised fees charged by the Board.

2. How to obtain the approved or revised text of regulations prepared by LCB

3. Methods used in determining the impact on a small business

The agency used informed, reasonable judgment in determining that there will be minimal impact on small businesses due to the small increase in specific fees. Small businesses impacted would be comprised of individuals who are self-employed.

4. Estimated economic effect of regulations on business and the public

a. Adverse and beneficial effects

The adoption of these regulations should have no adverse economic effect on business, the public or practitioners of occupational therapy. The benefits of these regulations are that the public and the practitioners (occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants) will be provided more clarity in NAC 640A and fees charged current licensees will be consistent with those charged new applicants.

b. Immediate and long-term effects

The immediate and long-term effects of the regulations proposed in R062-19 provides consistency in fees charged licensed occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants in Nevada.

5. Cost for enforcement of the regulations

There are no additional costs involved in enforcing the proposed regulations.

6. Overlap or duplication of other state or local governmental agencies

The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any regulation of other state or local governmental entities.

7. Regulation required by federal law

Not applicable

8. More stringent than federal regulations

The Board is not aware of any similar federal regulations of the same activity in which the state regulations are more stringent.

9. New or increases in existing fees

The proposed regulations include increases in existing fees for the renewal, reinstatement, and conversion of any license to reflect a biennial term of a license and to provide consistency with new license fees for a biennial term.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed action of the Board of Occupational Therapy may appear at the scheduled public hearing or address their comments, data, views or arguments in written form to the Board of Occupational Therapy, P.O. Box 34779, Reno, Nevada 89533. The Board of Occupational Therapy must receive all written submissions on or before **November 23, 2019**. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Board of Occupational Therapy may proceed immediately to action upon any written submissions.

A copy of this notice and the regulations to be adopted, R062-19, will be on file at the Nevada State Library, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notice and the regulations to be adopted, R062-19, will be available from the Board of Occupational Therapy, P.O. Box 34779, Reno, Nevada 89533, and in all counties at the main public library, for inspection and copying by members of the public during business hours. This notice and the text of the proposed regulations are also available in the State of Nevada Register of Administrative Regulations, which is prepared and published monthly by the Legislative Counsel Bureau pursuant to NRS 233B.0653 and on the Internet at http://www.leg.state.nv.us. Copies of this notice and the proposed regulation will also be mailed to members of the public upon request.

Upon adoption of any regulations, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, will issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption or incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.
